 - last reply was received 28 June 1999
 - 15 leads now exhausted
 - from founding in 1932 up to 02 July 1976, whereabouts of minutes is unknown as of 06 July 1999
 - starting with 02 July 1976, it is open to speculation as to why there appear to be minutes missing up to but not including 27 July 1991
- b. **Southern Leeds Restructuring Study:** D. Kilpatrick

Twnsps of Rear and Leeds & Landsdowne, Front of Leeds & Landsdowne, Front of Escott and Town of Ganauque are considering amalgamation. Four public meetings have been held. As far as D Kilpatrick knows, there was no representation from the LBLPA.
- c. **Jet-Ski / PWC Restriction / Prohibition:** D. Kilpatrick
 - i. **False information given to Kilpatrick in Mar 1999.** In late June 1999, in response to further inquiries, Kilpatrick was advised that the provision "prohibition of personal watercraft" Kilpatrick had communicated the false information directly to 430 persons. Kilpatrick requested this information be confidential until 10 July 1999, when, at the meeting of the petition circulation volunteers, he can up-date them. Information was obtained through MPP office, Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, Application for Boating Regulations. **Currently PWC are off the application form from Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing.**

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- ii. Kilpatrick continues to work as per instruction of LBLPA AGM July 1998. Runciman letter 30 June 1999 recommended contact with Canadian Coastguard Office of Boating Safety for Ontario which he did by phone and fax July 02 1999; MNR Peterborough: Kilpatrick did this 2-6 July 1999 by phone and fax. Still awaiting answers to original three questions of 06 March 1999.
 - iii. Meeting of PWC Petition People arranged for 10 July 1999. As of 05 July, 12 + Kilpatrick.
 - iv. at AGM July 1999, up-date will be made
 - v. Kilpatrick requests cheque to Royal Canadian Legion, Delta for Donation of \$25.00 for of Hall on 10 July 1999. Amount deemed reasonable by Exec. MJA
 - vi. The question of further financial support will be raised at AGM
- d. Water levels:** D Kilpatrick.
- i. On 30 June 1999, after many tries and waiting for call-back, Kilpatrick spoke with MNR Kemptville person responsible for Water Levels, Dale McLenaghan (613) 258-8204 Ext. 385. Long discussion regarding idea of assisting MNR in providing water levels as consistently as possible.
 - ii. Agreed to meeting: on sites, probably late August 1999; McLenaghan, Kilpatrick and persons who have indicated their interest. Santos indicated interest.

Big Rideau Lake Association makes good use of "Rideau Laker". Santos suggests that LBLPA needs something newsworthy first and suggested that it might be Cottage Watch going

- i. 21 June 1999, talked to Christie Curley, Area Biologist for Leeds, MNR, Kemptville: Splake stocking tried in LBL 1987-1991. Not successful. Discontinued.
 - ii. 24 June 1999, again to Christy Curley: Bass stocking in LBL seems to have ceased 1n 1977. Population at max at the time.
 - Is it feasible to consider resuming stocking?
 - If so, where do we start? (meeting? creel survey? Cholomondeley suggested/recommended in September 1995)
 - Capell thinks MNR has dropped bass from their stocking policies and seems more concerned with lake trout and walleye management unless problem is evident
 - Bring subject up at AGM

**CURTAILMENT and/or PROHIBITING OF OPERATION OF "JET-SKIS" / PWCs ON
LOWER BEVERLEY LAKE.**

REPORT OF EVENTS TO DATE.

By Doug Kilpatrick, President, LBLPA.

- 25 Jul 1992. First raising. By a member. Investigated following years. Decided on education.
1. 18 Jul 1998. Annual General Meeting. Executive was authorized to take action toward curtailment and/or banning of the operation of jet-skis / PWCs on Lower Beverley Lake.
 2. 11 Aug 1998, Executive Meeting. D. Kilpatrick was instructed by Executive to obtain advice from appropriate agencies as to how to proceed.
D. Kilpatrick held informal discussions with three or four people who he thought might have had something to offer.
 3. 06 Mar 1999. D. Kilpatrick, by the same letter to each of
Mr. Joe Jordan MP for Leeds-Grenville in the Federal Parliament,
Mr. Robert Runciman, MPP for Leeds-Grenville in the Provincial Parliament,
The Federation of Ontario Cottagers' Associations (FOCA),
asked three questions:
 - a. What procedure should this association follow in order to bring about the banning/curtailment of the operation of jet-skis/PWCs on Lower Beverley Lake?
 - b. If there is not a procedure in place, what steps should we follow in establishing a procedure?
 - c. What conditions must we demonstrate in order to achieve the banning/curtailment?
 4. 25 Mar 1999. D. Kilpatrick, by mail received through Mr. Runciman's constituency office, from the Regional Office of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing (MMAH) a two-page PROCEDURE — Boating Restriction Applications and a one-page form "APPLICATION FOR BOATING RESTRICTION REGULATIONS (Canada Shipping Act.)"
The first two of D. Kilpatrick's questions were answered.
However, in regard to PWCs, there is no reference to "curtailment" of operation, only "prohibition".
In the Procedure, there is a recommendation for the inclusion of petitions.
 5. April, 1999. LBLPA Newsletter. D. Kilpatrick reported on the above and asked for volunteers who wished to help with the circulation of a Jet-ski/PWC Prohibition Petition.
By 08 Jul 1999, 11 Registrations indicated that a maximum of 16 people would help with the circulation of a petition.
 6. 03 Jun 1999. Because the third question (What conditions must be demonstrated in order to achieve the banning/curtailment?) — had not been answered, D. Kilpatrick, by fax, repeated the question to the source of the two documents, MMAH.
The verbal reply was that MMAH did not know because the question never before had been asked. D. Kilpatrick was referred to the Regional Office of the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources, Kingston.
 7. 10 Jun 1999. By fax, D. Kilpatrick asked the question of MNR Kingston, and included a copy of each of the "PROCEDURE" and the "APPLICATION".
 8. 22 Jun 1999. Verbal reply from MMAH Kingston to D. Kilpatrick: MNR Kingston person had consulted with his advisor at MNR Peterborough. They found that the documents provided to Kilpatrick on 25 Mar 1999 were out of date. The current documents agree in every detail with the out of date documents EXCEPT on the Application form, "prohibition of personal watercraft" had been removed. The persons at MNR Kingston and Peterborough did not have the reasons as to why the Proposed Restriction had been removed, or when.
 9. 25 Jun 1999. By 4-page fax to each of MPP Runciman, MMAH Kingston, MNR Kingston, D. Kilpatrick expressed dismay that after three months of letters, faxes and phone calls, he was no further ahead and had provided incorrect information DIRECTLY to 430 people.

9. 25 Jun 1999 (cont)

D. Kilpatrick asked for assistance in answering the original three questions, and asked for reply in time for the meeting of the LBLPA Executive on 08 Jul 1999.
10. 30 Jun 1999. Verbal reply from MWAH Kingston to D. Kilpatrick: Sorry about the error; written reply would be forthcoming from Mr. Runciman's office.
11. 02 Jul 1999, by courier to D. Kilpatrick from Mr. Runciman's Executive Assistant at the Ontario Legislative Assembly, Toronto: This is a federal matter, falling under the Canada Shipping Act. Therefore, contact —
Canadian Coast Guard, Office of Boating Safety, Central and Arctic Region, Supervisor of Boating Safety, Sarnia, Ontario.
and also
The MNR Person in Peterborough, who might be able to help.
12. 02 Jul 1999. D. Kilpatrick phoned CCG Office of Boating Safety, Sarnia. Supervisor not in the building. D. Kilpatrick spoke with his deputy. Deputy asked for fax of original three questions and all documents received from MWAH. He and Supervisor would cause the matter to be discussed and a reply to be sent.
D. Kilpatrick sent the fax that afternoon.
D. Kilpatrick also phoned MNR Person in Peterborough. Out of the office until 05 Jul 99. Kilpatrick requested call-back. None on Mon 05 Jul 1999.
13. 06 Jul 1999. D. Kilpatrick phoned MNR Person in Peterborough. Long conversation. Complex matter involving levels of government from municipal to federal and several provincial and federal ministries, which D. Kilpatrick already knew from the MWAH documents.
She requested a fax of the original three questions and all documents received from MWAH. She also recommended D. Kilpatrick obtain the booklet "THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES' GUIDE FOR BOATING RESTRICTIONS" from the Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans.
She stated that she would try to determine when and why "prohibition of personal watercraft" had been removed. She would reply to D. Kilpatrick.
D. Kilpatrick sent the fax that afternoon.
14. 07 Jul 1999. D. Kilpatrick, from the Federal Member of Parliament, received reply to D. Kilpatrick's letter of 06 Mar 1999.
Federal Member recommended D. Kilpatrick contact the same MNR Peterborough person as had been recommended by Provincial Member. He also provided the booklet which the MNR Peterborough Person had recommended D. Kilpatrick obtain.
15. 08 Jul 1999: LBLPA Executive Meeting. D. Kilpatrick —
 - Reported events to date;
 - Informed that meeting of Persons Wishing To Help With the Circulation of the Petition had been arranged for 10 Jul 1999, at which those in attendance would be brought up to date;
 - Informed that a report would be made to the LBLPA Annual General Meeting on 17 Jul 1999;
 - Obtained \$25 as a donation to the Royal Canadian Legion, Delta, in appreciation for the use of its hall for the meeting of 10 Jul 1999;
 - Requested further financial support of the effort and was instructed to take the request to the Annual General Meeting on 17 Jul 1999.

- 16. 10 Jul 1999: Meeting of Persons Who Would Help With Circulation of Petition.
 - D. Kilpatrick brought the meeting up to date.
 - Factors relevant to continuing toward curtailment / banning of PWCs were weighed.
 - Decision in favour of proceeding was unanimous.
 - Effort will be a combination of -
 - Positive measures to cope with the problem, while
 - Working toward prohibition.
 - Positive Coping Strategies were listed.
 - Petition Circulation: Decided to
 - Delay until information received from
 - Cdn Coast Guard Ontario Supervisor of Boating Safety, and
 - MNR Peterborough Person who is in the Resource Stewardship and Development Branch,
 - Circulate primarily by mail, with as much personal contact as possible.
 - Funding: Decided to ask the LBLPA Annual Meeting 17 Jul 1999 for up to \$400 from 1999 revenue to cover costs which are likely between now and 31 May 2000, with the understanding that further funds may be requested later.
 - Reply from FOCA: D. Kilpatrick will request one.

REPORT ON EFFORTS TO DATE to the LBLPA Annual General Meeting, 17 Jul 1999,
by Doug Kilpatrick, President.

- 02 Sep 1976: From the LBLPA Minutes available as of this date, this was the earliest date on which concern was raised about pollution into Lower Beverley Lake.
- 31 May 1989: Executive Meeting. MOTION: That a study be made of all sewage disposal systems on properties abutting Lower Beverley Lake. CARRIED Unanimously.
- 28 Jul 1990: Annual General Meeting. Committee formed to work on the matter.
- ? Spring 1991?: The committee reported. It had made some inquiries. It had found that it was NOT feasible to try to pin-point properties which were definitely sources of pollution. The project was abandoned.
- 19 Jul 1997: Annual General Meeting. By MOTION, approval was given for a Sewage System (and if possible a Shoreline) Survey for those who agreed to it. (The survey was to be done following the models of Upper Rideau Lake 1992, Big Crosbie Lake 1993 and Christie Lake 1995.)
- 1998: Delays were encountered. Further information was gathered. Action was delayed for a year.
- Apr 1999: LBLPA Newsletter. The matter was reviewed. New information was added to the effect that in order to be of value to the lake, it would be necessary to have 85% of property owners participate. On the LBLPA Membership Registration Form 1999, property owners indicated in responses as of 08 Jul 99: "No" to the Survey 11. "Yes" to the Survey 21. Neither "No" nor "Yes" to the Survey 47. Total Responses 79.
- 08 Jul 1999: Executive Meeting. Pursuant to the authority of the MOTION of 19 Jul 1997, the Executive DECIDED: — NOT to organize and operate a Sewage System / Shoreline Survey of the type which had been described on 19 Jul 1997, and the Newsletter of April, 1999; — For those who said "yes", a survey can be done by a non-profit environmental organization known as "Lanark & Leeds Green Community". This was arranged by D. Kilpatrick. In advance of appointment arrangements by LL Green, D. Kilpatrick will try to contact those who said "yes" to describe the LL Green project. LL Green plans to conduct the surveys, give advice and education in the period 16 - 22 Aug 1999.

MESSAGE TO ~~19~~ PEOPLE (as of ~~26 Jun~~ 1999) WHO SAID "yes" to SS/SS in response to 390 LBLPA Newsletters sent out early May 1999.

1. 390 Newsletters were sent to property owners around Lower Beverley Lake in early May 1999.
2. Replies were requested for 11 Jun 1999.
3. As of 26 Jun 1999, only ~~19~~¹⁸ property owners said "yes" to having the survey done.
4. Therefore, it is NOT feasible for the LBLPA to make the effort to organize the Survey.

We hope that those who decided NOT to participate have Sewage Systems which pose no threat to the lake. We have our doubts because the concern over inefficient sewage systems around the lake has existed since the Executive Meeting 31 May 1989 -- ten years!

5. LBLPA has made arrangements with a non-profit organization called LANARK and LEEDS GREEN, known as "L-L Green":
 - a. IF THE PROPERTY OWNER WISHES,
 - b. LL Green will do a survey of the property;
 - c. Time per Property is about 1 1/2 hours;
 - d. The focus of LL Green is principally on Shoreline Stewardship, but Sewage Systems will be considered to the maximum possible extent within the capability of LL Green;
 - e. It is hoped the Property Owner will be able to provide basic information about their sewage system, such as
 - i. Type of system,
 - ii. When it was installed,
 - iii. Locations of such as pipes, tank and tile bed,
 - iv. How often it is pumped out, and when was the last pump-out,
 - v. Location of Water Well,
 - vi. etc.
 - f. A confidential report, recommendations and information about the care of the system will be given to the Property Owner;
 - g. It is hoped the Property Owner will take follow-up action, including questions to LL Gren;
 - h. LL Green is a non-profit organization sponsored by the Rideau Environmental Action League (REAL) of Smiths Falls ON.
It receives its funding from about 30 partners, including Federal, Provincial & Municipal governments, and businesses.
 - i. There is no charge for a property survey. but a donation from the Property Owner in the order of \$25 would be welcomed.
 - j. LL Green can allocate approximately 14 days to Lower Beverley Lake.
 - k. For Island Properties, it will be necessary for the Property Owner to provide ferry service to the LL Green surveyors.
 - l. LL Green will try to contact the Property Owners who said "yes" on the LBLPA Registration Form to make arrangements for the visit.
