BEVERLY, ONTARIOANNUAL MEETING

AUGUST 7, 1982

The Annual Meeting and Picnic of the Beverley Lake Protective Association was held at the Summer Home of the Alfred Brown Family, on the above site. Our President, Al Brown, called the meeting to order with the sound of the Traditional Gavel. Al extended a cordial welcome to all those who had made the effort and taken the time to come to a meeting of cottage dwellers. The Secretary, Marie Shelley, gave the opening prayer. The minutes of the 1981 Annual Picnic and Business Meeting were read and approved by a motion made by Ed VanVoorhis and seconded by Emma Angermann. The Secretary read a communication from Arch Ostrom, thanking the Association for the invitation to attend the meeting, but due to a previous commitment, he was unable to join us. The other five members of the Town Council were also invited, but they did not respond.

Our Treasurer, George Gowdy, submitted the following report: Bank balance, August 1, 1981, \$404.00; Interest, \$12.55; Membership receipts, \$183.36; Picnic expenses, Aug. 1, 1981, \$14.58; Regatta, \$35.00; Secretarial expenses, \$10.04; leaving a balance of \$540.30. The Treasurer's report was accepted by a motion made by York Mills and seconded by Mary Fran Rodenhausen. It carried.

The following committee reports were submitted: Membership, Lois Brown had no report; Social Committee, Dawn Broughten reported that all preparations were in order for today's festivities; Sports Committee, Ed VanVoorhis gave a resume of this year's regatta and the successful events that took place. The number of young people participating was almost doubled. There was a great crowd in attendance, also; Lake Improvement; Dr. D. B. Wilson reported that the lake was in good shape, so far as pollution is concerned. The breeding place for fingerlings has been closed because of pollution, and just as soon as another location is developed and fingerlings are available, we will be receiving our quota. Dr. Wilson offered to look into the transfer of pike from upper Beverley Lake to Lower Beverley; **Nominating Committee**, Franklin Ellis, Jr. submitted the following report, President, Ed VanVoorhis; First Vice President, Blythe Broughten; Second Vice President, Pam Howe; Secretary, Marie Shelley; Treasurer, George Gowdy. Lois Brown made a motion that we accept the report of the Nominating Committee and Louise Wills seconded the motion. It carried.

Under Old Business, we discussed a letter received from the Town Council in which they told us that it would be impossible for them to build a Pavilion in the Town Park because of the lack of funds.

Under New Business, Franklin Ellis, Jr. reported that the U. of Toronto was doing a survey on lakes and cottages, which should be very helpful to our organization, when it is completed.

A memorial service was held in memory of Mr. Gerry Angermann, Chris Angermann, Warren Sexton, Mrs. Russell Shuttleworth, Mr. Norman Gibson, Mrs. Mary Raison, Mr. Gordon Gamble, and Mrs. Irene Stevens, Mr. Franklin Ellis, Sr., and Mr. Harold (Russ) Miller.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed by Al Brown presenting the Traditional Gavel to our newly elected President, Ed VanVoorhis. Ed asked the audience to consider recommending someone of editorial ability, to supervise the publication of an Association Newspaper, to further the work and concerns of our association.

A motion for adjournment was made by Al Brown and seconded by Lois B., before we could express our appreciation to the Brown family for their hospitality in extending the use of their property for this year's meeting.

Blythe Broughten, Program Chairman, presented Don Galloway, from the Ministry of Natural Resources, out of Brockville, who gave an excellent talk and statistics on the subject of "Recreational Use of Lakes and the Water quality of them". The water in Beverley Lake is safe for swimming, but not for drinking, without treatment.

We all enjoyed the food and the social hour, afterwards.
