Re: SAFE BOATING -- RECOMMENDATION THAT SUNSET BE THE TIME WHEN
-- Navigation Lights must be shown, and
-- Waterskiing and Other Towing Activities CEASE.

Reference is made to the Safe Boating Guide 1999.

Whereas the regulation for Navigation Lights requires that they be shown
-- After sunset and before sunrise or
-- In periods of reduced visibility:

and whereas the regulation for Waterskiing and Other Towing Activities requires their prohibition

-- from one hour after sunset to sunrise;

and whereas persons engaged in Waterskiing and Other Towing Activities are more likely to be aware of sunset than of one hour after sunset;

and whereas there is more danger to a person being towed in twilight than there is to a craft being operated in twilight without navigation lights;

therefore the Alliance of Rideau Lakes Associations Gataraqui Region—Lakes Stewards Network strongly recommends that in the interest of consistency and safety, the time of day and visibility conditions for Waterskiing and Other Towing Activities, as soon as possible, be made the same as for the showing of Navigation Lights.

i.e.: Navigation Lights must be shown

- -- After sunset and before sunrise or
- -- In periods of reduced visibility.

Wterskiing and Other Towing Activities are PROHIBITED

-- After sunset and before sunrise or

-- In periods of reduced visibility.
