4. Water Safety/Safe Boating: LBL Twsp Park July 1 2000. Kilpatrick: OPP: Three cruisers with one regular officer and two auxiliary officers; LBLA members: Kilpatrick plus three of the seven who said they would come. Park was full. Almost no traffic in. Abandoned road-side contacts and went to the park, distributing information and collecting data. Data sheets from boaters: 14, Park total data sheets: 22. Those involved considered it to be valuable effort: showed that OPP/ LBLA cares about safe boating. Data sheets collected from LBLA 37. Total: 59

5. Cottage Watch:

Truyens hoping to do some canvassing, will find out status of road signs, will report at AGM -Kilpatrick : Kendrick and White Birch Lanes sign has been placed, four dock signs placed on Kendrick Lane.

6. Water Levels: MNR trend data:

Santos contacted Dale McLenaghan: note that water level is at desired level now, MNR is putting log and one half back in dam.

Discussion arises: Truyens notes increase in blomass and asks why. Santos notes clarity is increasing.

Goodsell mentions newspaper article that suggests phosphorous testing is meaningless. Also noted: letters of appreciation to Anne Bendig and Dale McLenaghan to be written.

7. Fishery on LBL Santos/Kilpatrick:

June 17, @ 9:30am @ Lyndhurst Library, meeting with Anne Bendig MNR, commercial fishermen and others. Santos will summarize meeting and E-mail to Goodsell/Kilpatrick for editing. Santos will report at AGM.

Hart's letter was sent to municipalities. Santos suggests LBLA sends letter to municipalities to rescind last year's letter regarding commercial fishery concerns in light of new information discussed with MNR (NSCIN survey).

8. Fish and Wildlife Guardian Program by Kilpatrick:

9. Delta Town Dock update by Kilpatrick/Truyens:

In place before July 1. Santos to send letter of appreciation.

Sewage System/Shoreline Survey update by Kilpatrick:

LL Green advised that funding for year 2000 is not available. Kilpatrick will advise un-surveyed people from 1999 and 2000 that they're unable to survey in 2000 but that names will be kept on file and action taken when possible. No anticipated date yet.

11. Water Quality by Santos:

LBL testing program: proceeding as usual - we're not paying for extra phosphorous testing.

UBL testing: Invite Leonard Vincent (P.O. Box 194 Delta, 928-2671) to AGM and add to mailing list

12. Signs at Boat Ramps:

Existing signs have been placed by Santos and Kilpatrick. Kilpatrick suggests we need new sign at Lyndhurst because of vandalism: next year will move Kendrick's sign to Lyndhurst. Kilpatrick will draft wording for future signs. Speed signs (5) placed by Santos in Delta creek, 2 by Kilpatrick in upper reaches of Lyndhurst Creek.

13. Other Initiatives:

Take a little lead out: Santos to suggest to Angermann to but out Wing's inventory.

Santos asks why there isn't a lead ban in Ontario, Kilpatrick to inquire at ARLA and CRCA if we should pursue this issue.

Osprey nesting platforms: Leeds Stewardship Council has selected site in LBL Park, away from noise, yet visible to visitors. Platform to be erected in the Fall of 2000. Another to be erected in the Morton area.

Loon nesting -- no progress. Kilpatrick suggests we need them during water level fluctuations. Any volunteers at annual meeting?

LBLA Website/publicity:

To be posted on website: Hart's letter, Boating Competency, LBL fishery meeting with MNR Publicity: 5 safe boating guides and 10 Safe and considerate boating brochures at Lyndhurst gift shop for a fee of \$25 for June, July and August. Goodsell questions this fee and suggests the library. Kilpatrick will evaluate this year.

15. Annual Newsletter Improvements by Truyens:

Stuffing bee will help. Look for a postal machine at Warners and at Township office. Kilpatrick will get 500 envelopes of each type and get to Truyens this summer. Kilpatrick requests 10 full copies of package. Santos suggests there may be too many forms. Truyens suggests a shortened renewal form for members, but idea was quashed.
