Celebrating the Season



Just think of it.... An evening stroll or a wagon ride amidst trees and buildings that are all magically lit with holiday lights. If this interests you, then Lower Beverley Lake Park is the place for you this holiday season!

Launching on November 19th, Delta Park will be open for tours on five consecutive Saturday nights. More than 85,000 Christmas lights will adorn the trees and buildings throughout the park and will highlight various displays, a candy cane lane, a gingerbread house, a nativity scene, Santa's workshop and a miniature display of Delta's heritage buildings. Mr. and Mrs. Santa Claus will be on hand to receive those special wish lists, pose for photographs and give out holiday treats.

Wagon rides to the park will only be available from the Delta Fair Grounds on ½ hour intervals starting at 5:00 p.m. Patrons may still walk through the park by entering at the Boat Launch gate.

SEASONAL CAMPERS DONATE \$7,000

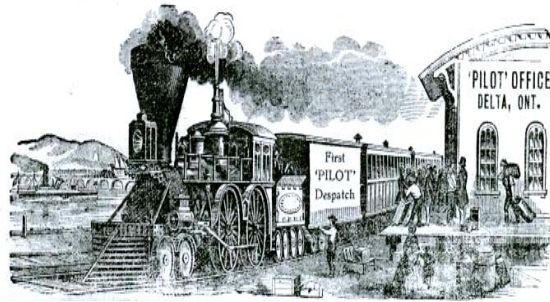

BEAUTIFICATION NEWS

Stevens Park
Named in honour of our first settler Elder Abel Stevens Sr.

Abel Stevens was born at Quaker Hill, New York, November 11, 1755. Later moving with his parents to Pittsford, Vermont to receive his education he served as a British agent during the Revolutionary War despite being enrolled in the rebel militia. While living in Vermont after the war, he became a deacon of the Baptist Church in 1776. Attracted by Lieutenant Governor Simcoe's 1793 offer of land in Upper Canada, Stevens first scouted the area around Delta where he identified the fall of water between the two Upper Beverley Lakes and Lower Beverley Lake. In December of that year, he petitioned the Augusta Land Board for land in this location. Returning in February of 1794 with six families who were mostly his own, he squatted on the land. He brought mill irons with him and eventually built a wooden sawmill. In 1796 he was granted 600 acres of land allowing the settlement of Stevensown (Delta) to be established where many of his descendants still live today. In 1826, Abel Stevens died at home and was buried in an unmarked grave in the Deane Cemetery. During his lifetime, Elder Abel Stevens Sr. played an integral role in the development of the former Hastings Township and the community of Delta.

Iron Foundry
Philo Hrook (1808-1894) was another prominent Delta resident. Along with being a pillar of the Methodist Church and one of the leaders of the Temperance movement, he was also a member of the first Township Council of 1851, where he was Mayor from 1851-1872. The iron industry started with Elder Abel Stevens who saw the possibility of an iron smelter using iron ore that was found on the shores of Lower Beverley Lake. In 1822 Abel Stevens, Jr. and Nathan Super constructed a foundry behind the former Beverley Elementary School property. A dam was erected on Foundry Creek near Philipville to supply water power necessary to operate the machinery. In 1839 Super sold his interests to the Trustees of the Foundry Company. After Hrook purchased the Iron Foundry in 1843, it grew into Delta by 1861 and included more complex machinery such as a steam engine to supplement the water power. The only thing remaining of the foundry today are some ruins, however their legacy lives on in the names of "Foundry Street" and "Iron Lane" along with the Heritage House of Philo Hrook.

Beverley Elementary Public School
Opened in the fall of 1961, Beverley Elementary School was constructed at 2 Foundry Street by the Hastings and South Hastings Township School Board to consolidate the small one and two room schools in the area which included, but not limited to Chantry, Dartmouth, Delta and Philipville. Throughout its 40-year history, documents of "Beverley Bobcats" were collected at this school. Sadly, the school was closed in 2001 and was later demolished because of environmental issues. Ironically the 1880 and 1882 two-room school house which was built on Williams Street still stands at the time.

Thanks to an ongoing partnership between the Lower Beverley Lake Park Management Board, the Delta Beautification Committee and the Township of Rideau Lakes Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee, a heritage plaque will soon be installed in Stevens Park.

This plaque, which showcases Elder Abel Stevens, Delta's Iron Foundry and Beverley Elementary School, will be the eighth in a series of heritage displays in which photos and anecdotes of Delta's history are featured.

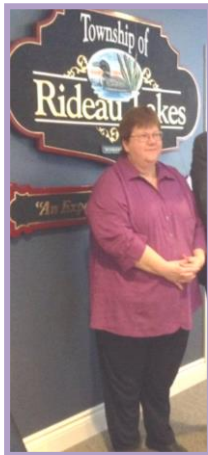
