As soon as the sap starts to run, the community of Delta begins preparing for the Delta Maple Syrup Festival. This year's event promises to offer entertainment, refreshments, activities and of course, maple syrup and pancakes to the thousands of people who opt to visit the Village of Delta during the weekend of April 21st and 22nd.

In preparation for the 51st Anniversary Edition, a special planning meeting will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, January 14th in the United Church Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend and share suggestions and plans for this year's event.



During the 2017 festival, 2200 patrons enjoyed 135 kg / 297 lbs. of sausages, 260 kg / 573 lbs. of pancake batter mix, 2500 patties of butter, 240 litres of orange drink, and 443 lbs. /150 litres of maple syrup.

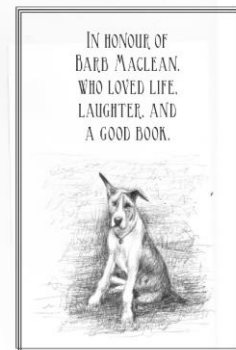

ANNA GREENHORN RECEIVES SENATE 150th ANNIVERSARY MEDAL

The Senate 150th Anniversary Medal commemorates the first-time senators came to Ottawa to sit in Parliament on November 6, 1867. Senators each received 12 medals to award. The medals are being awarded to Canadians whose generosity, dedication, volunteerism and hard work make their communities a better place to live.



"Senators want to take this opportunity to reflect on the incredible contributions made by Canadians from all walks of life. We want to give some much-deserved recognition to Canadians who share the Senate's goal of giving voice to people or issues that sometimes fly under the radar or don't grab headlines." "Anna Greenhorn has made significant contributions to improving her community over the years through her efforts as a tireless volunteer. She was a founding member of the Board of Directors that established Country Roads Community Health Centre in 1988, bringing much needed health care to our underserved area.

As a teacher of Delta's Beverley Elementary School with a passion for literacy, she was on the original Board of Directors that created Rideau Lakes Public Library. Anna was a municipal councilor for the Township of Bastard and Burgess, and also a member of County Council. She served in the United Church for years as a Sunday School teacher and trustee.

Anna chairs the Beautification Committee in Philipsville, and is an active member of the Heritage Committee and the Lower Beverley Lake Park Management Board. Anna enthusiastically champions and promotes her greatest interest, the heritage of the Rideau Lakes area. For more than forty years, she has given life to the history of the Old Stone Mill in Delta as a tour guide, fundraiser, secretary and advocate."



The medal's front features the Senate's badge and the reverse side depicts the Senate Chamber.
A space is provided to inscribe the name of the recipient.

The medals are 7.6cm (3") in diameter and made of Muntz metal which is an alloy of bronze, copper and zinc with a matte bronze finish.
