RIDEAU LAKES RECYCLING CHANGES

NEW in 2020: The following plastic items have been <u>removed</u> from the recycling stream and now must be **placed in your garbage bag**, as of January 1, 2020:



- ALL plastic bags (grocery, bread bags, wood pellet, water softener, milk, ziploc, cereal liners etc)
- ALL black plastics; milk/soup/juice cartons;
- tetra packs; foil juice containers and clam shell containers.
- most coffee pods, granola bar/ vegetables candy/chocolate bar wrappers;
- plastic wrap from cheese, cold meats, & fruits ; bubble wrap; hangers; laundry baskets,
- plastic utensils; straws; hard rigid packaging; coffee/tea cups, wine/drinking glasses and glass cookware; soap pump dispenser tops
- make-up containers (e.g. lipstick/ lip chap tubes, blush compacts, eyeliner pencils);
- hoses; shelving; totes; ornaments/decorations; toothpaste tubes; razors; feminine product wrappers;
- pill packs for medication;
- mixed content containers (cardboard and metal pringle chip tubes, frozen juice tubes; coffee canisters
- school supplies (rulers, scissors, plastic string);
- home improvements items (vents, piping, sockets); heavily waxed/coated boxes; lined/waxed dog food bags;

These items are garbage, so place them in a garbage bag.

Other changes in garbage collection include:

- An increase from 2 to 3 bags (with tags) will be accepted weekly.
- Brush and leaves will be accepted in Portland Transfer Station for \$35/tonne (this does not include limbs over 8 inches in diameter). The Voucher Program has been eliminated and rate/tonne reduced.
- Bag with tags will be accepted at the Portland Transfer Station

With many changes being made province-wide, this comes at a time when recycling facilities are demanding higher quality recycling (clean, acceptable) with stronger policies. Direct your recycling questions to Amy Schur, Ext. 285.

2019 was a sad summer as we lost two longstanding, active members of the lake association.

Ed VanVoorhis died in Watertown, NY on June 12, 2019. Ed was the President of the lake association from 1983-1985 and again in 2003-2005. In addition, he was the auditor of our annual finance reports for many years. Our Canoeshuk was the brainchild of Ed and with the help of the lake association and many lake family members, Ed oversaw the choosing of the stones, the carving and engraving of the stone canoe and the actual construction on the rock island by English Island. If you do not recognize his name, you most likely will recognize his lighthouse that lights our way through the narrows on Lower Beverley.

Millard Goodsell died in Florida on August 8, 2019. Millard was President of the lake association from 1969-1971 and again from 2001-2003. Always willing to help, Millard was active with the Delta (Rideau Lakes) Fire Department and with the Delta United Church.

Both men were known for their willingness to help and will be missed by many on our lake.
