Minutes

Minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed and accepted.

Financial and Member Registration

A copy of the financial summary from Betty Penstone is attached. Our newsletter postage had increased due to the enclosure of the 'neighbour' card, as had the cost for our insurance since we are no longer members of FOCA.

At present we have 144 paid members and 8 corporate members which is very good for this time of year.

Audit

Lynne will obtain more information from Betty's files. She will then forward all the required paperwork to Ed Van Voorhis.

Water Levels and Water Quality

The water quality has declined for the past year, as measured by phosphorus levels (Lake Partners program). It's possible this is related to the heavy rains last year, together with the high level of the lake and the unusually heavy pollens. Last summer had some typical ups and downs as in previous years.

Dave Champagne showed us his water testing kits. One is used to check dissolved oxygen levels, and includes a water sampling device for reaching deeper water. He has also obtained a new nitrogen testing kit, as the previous kit was several years old, and noted that it is recommended that chemicals for such kits be replaced annually. The monies collected in memoriam for Earl Patric will be used for the supplies.

Dave J reported that there are 2 eggs in the loon nest at Horse Island, as well as two eggs at Kendrick's, both of these nests on our platforms. The loon at the Three Sisters platform wouldn't get off her nest so Dave could check.
