

DELTA REFUGEE ASSISTANCE GROUP

A group of concerned citizens met at the Delta Baptist Church in January to share information and discuss how they could support refugee resettlement. Knowing that efforts were underway in the Brockville area to resettle at least ten refugee families, two members of the Delta group attended an informative presentation in Brockville with a representative of the United Nations High Commission on Refugees.

The Delta group met again in February and decided to call themselves the Delta Refugee Assistance Group. Interested citizens may still join the group which is comprised of Delta area residents along with the ministers from both the Delta Baptist and United Churches.

Working closely with the Brockville and Area Refugee Committee, the goal of the Delta group is to assist in welcoming refugees to our area and help them to settle into life in Canada. Efforts will be undertaken in our community and in local schools to increase the awareness of refugee needs. Fundraising efforts will also be undertaken to assist with the sponsorship of refugee families. People will be encouraged to volunteer their time and talents with the new arrivals.

New members are welcome to attend the next meeting of the Delta Refugee Assistance Group which will be held at the Okum residence, 60 King Street, Delta at 10:00 a.m. on March 2nd. HISTORY OF THE DELTA MAPLE SYRUP FESTIVAL

Delta was the <u>first</u> Maple Syrup Festival in the area. During the event planning stages for Canada's Centennial, a small group of dedicated volunteers met regularly in the Council Chambers at the Old Town Hall. As President of the group, Harold Russell worked tirelessly as he contacted every farmer, arranged sugar shack visits and tours, promoted sugaring off demonstrations, and jack wax parties.

Other members of the community who were involved heavily were Arch Ostrom, Sally Halladay, Ron Morris, Lloyd Sawyer, Howard Jones, Sid Talbot, Glenn and Irma Chant. There was very little advertising required but huge crowds came from far and near.

In the beginning, the Festival was a three day event which included busloads of students who visited Delta on school trips to enjoy pancakes and syrup which were served on both floors of the Old Town Hall. Visitors were able to tour the local sugar bushes and to watch maple syrup being bottled and maple candy being made in the Confederated Foods Syrup Plant.

Over the years, the Festival continued through the efforts of many local residents and Service Clubs until it recently became a project for the Directors of the Delta Agricultural Society.


